This group of ROAM laborers for the Lord managed to complete numerous and varied tasks for the camp.

Two cabins were repaired and refreshed by sanding and varnishing floors, installing plumbing in bathrooms, installing two new sinks including trimming, caulking and finishing work and removing half of a roof before re-roofing with shingles.

Beautiful, regulation-sized soccer goals were built from scratch by welding pipe and installing nets by two of the ROAM men. Two others refinished the entire main dining room cement floor.

In-between rainy days, a deck on the new dorm was completed using 21 sheets of 4 x 8 decking and a building was constructed.



The building involved framing and sheathing the outside walls before erecting them. The inside hallway walls were framed as well as several interior walls for eight separate rooms with bathrooms. Soundproofing the walls required each room wall to be double framed. Trusses were put up and readied for the roofers;

part of the plumbing and electrical was finished; the building was wrapped with vapor barrier; all windows were installed and the front porch was started.



Six shower floors in the girls' dorm were sanded and painted with pool paint. All the bunks were cleaned, moved and readied for use. The back door was repaired to remedy a large gap at the bottom.

Other tasks completed were: trouble shooting and correcting electrical problems in the kitchen; several railroad ties were moved to an area where a retaining wall is to be built; and the whole ROAMer group assisted with a weekend group of 175 ladies by serving, cooking and cleaning.

The ROAM women did various jobs as needed. Two women worked daily and exclusively in the kitchen with others assisting them on occasion. Some refinished a kitchen wall and shelving unit--emptying, scraping, sanding, priming, painting, reorganizing and restocking the shelves. Another wall was painted along with refinishing and painting the door of the walk-in cooler. Other paint jobs included the six new showers and outside of a cabin while other ladies were kept busy with cleaning, laundry and various impromptu jobs.
